

The City of Powder Springs has developed a city-wide trail system that will connect neighborhoods, existing parks, commercial and employment centers, public facilities, the historic downtown area and the regional Silver Comet Trail. The first in this system, the Wild Horse Trail, opened for public use on June 3, 2000 and the Lucille Trail Phase I opened in October 2001. Lucille Trail Phase II followed in 2004.

The Wildhorse Trail is a 10-foot wide, paved concrete facility that begins at the Wild Horse Creek Park at Macedonia Road and continues south 1.5 miles along Wild Horse and Noses Creeks until it connects with the Silver Comet Trail at Carter Road. The Wild Horse Trail crosses Hopkins Road at grade and Powder Springs Road via a bridge underpass. It features the largest red maple tree in the State (a "State Champion"), a wetlands observation tower just south of Hopkins Road, and a neighborhood park - Hopkins Road Park. Parking and restroom facilities are located at the access point at Wild Horse Creek Park on Macedonia Road, and additional parking is located at Carter Road. The Lucille Trail is also a 10-foot wide paved concrete facility that begins at the town square and extends west along Dallas-Powder Springs Road and then north along the western bank of Lucille Creek until it connects to Shipp Road. This 1-mile facility crosses the Silver Comet Trail at C. H. James Parkway and includes a small parking area at Shipp Road. Additional parking is available at the



Florence Road/C. H. James Parkway trailhead.

The City trails are designed for use by casual walkers, hikers, joggers, bicyclists, in-line skaters and persons with disabilities. The trails will be closed between dusk and dawn and during and immediately after a rainstorm.




Motorized vehicles and horses are not permitted on the trails. The bicycle unit of the Powder Springs Police Department provides routine patrols. 🦋

Trail Safety & Etiquette

- Stay on trail surface;
- Use trail only during daylight hours;
- Respect the privacy of adjacent land owners;
- Pass on the left / Keep right when moving;
- Travel in a consistent and predictable manner;
- Stop, look and yield to traffic at road crossings;
- Keep pets leashed;
- Cyclists and skaters should wear helmets;
- Use the buddy system / Do not travel alone;
- Do not bring alcohol, drugs or firearms;
- Leave the trail as clean as you found it;
- Do not use motor vehicles or horses;
- Do not use trail during or immediately after a rainstorm.
